“Internet Safety” and “Acceptable Use” Policy

The Internet has become an important tool for lifelong learning in all areas of education – including music. Access to information about music history and composers, multimedia music games and learning activities, and interactive tools to create music and play with sound are just a few of the applications that have added a whole dimension to music education.

However, as with many aspects of progress, certain abuses make policy statements such as this one, a necessity.

- ❖ Students should only use the studio computers and tablets and the wireless Internet to work on tasks suggested by the teacher. NO homework or email!
- ❖ When researching a specific topic or composer, students should not “surf” to other sites that have not been previewed by the teacher.
- ❖ Students should use the Internet in a responsible, ethical, and legal manner. The use of the Internet is a privilege, not a right, while at Music Is Marvelous. This privilege may be revoked at any time for inappropriate behavior.
- ❖ It is possible that students may accidentally access objectionable material on the Internet. If this happens, students should immediately report this access to “Ms. Moira”.
- ❖ Parents are encouraged to discuss responsible use of the Internet in this studio with students.

The following activities are not permitted:

- ❖ To upload or download any file without the permission of the teacher.
- ❖ To DISABLE or CHANGE THE SETTINGS or in any way DAMAGE computers, tablets, or iPads.
- ❖ To access another student’s materials, game scores or files without permission.
- ❖ To copy, download, or distribute any copyrighted material without permission
